
Guide to Blackboard Collaborate

This year's edition of the TABU Dag will be organized fully online using Gather. Town and Blackboard Collaborate. This document will provide you with a short guide on how to access the Blackboard Collaborate. We recommend you to read the <u>Get Started guide for participants</u> and/or <u>presenters</u> by Blackboard Collaborate before the meet-up. It is also possible to follow a short tutorial when you have entered the meeting room.

Accessing Blackboard Collaborate

Blackboard Collaborate is an online application that runs in your browser. It is not necessary to create an account or download software to access our Blackboard Collaborate session. We ask presenters to arrive a little early, so the organizers can give them presenter rights. Click here to read more about finding your way in the session.

By default, your webcam will be off and your audio will be muted when you enter the main room. We ask all attendees to keep their audio muted when someone is presenting, but you are welcome to turn on your webcam. To turn on your webcam and/or microphone, click on the
